

# YOUR VOTING RIGHTS IN NORTH CAROLINA

- **Voter ID.** BRING ID if you are a first-time voter who registered by mail and did not provide ID verification with your registration application. You may provide a North Carolina driver's license, current utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck or other government document.
- **Change of residence.** If you moved from one address to another within the same precinct, you have the right to vote at the voting place of that precinct upon oral or written affirmation of your change of address. If you moved to another county, you need to register again at your new place of residence. However, if you move within the 30 days prior to the election, you may vote in your former county of residence.
- **Clothing, buttons, caps and other accessories.** DO NOT wear any clothes or accessories that contain references to candidates, parties or political slogans. Such conduct is prohibited by North Carolina law if done within 50 feet of any poll.
- **No-electioneering perimeter.** No electioneering is allowed within 50 feet of the polling place.
